<u>Clermont State School Homework Policy</u> (Updated: 2018)

Homework at Clermont State School aims to be an educationally enhancing experience by revising and practising common concepts of literacy and numeracy.

Homework provides students with opportunities to consolidate their classroom learning, pattern behaviour for lifelong learning beyond the classroom and involve family member in their learning.

Mathematics and English are the key learning areas covered as part of the homework program.

Homework criteria is set for each year level. For each year level there is a maximum expectation for time to be spent on homework tasks. Activities are devised to be competed weekly. Reinforcement of common concepts is achieved through regular activities.

We believe that homework that enhances student learning:

- Is purposeful and relevant to student needs
- Is appropriate to the phase of learning (early and middle)
- Is appropriate to the capability of the student
- Develops the student's independence as a learner
- Is varied, challenging and clearly related to class work
- Allows for student commitment to recreational, family and cultural activities
